NEW IN 2021- Please complete **Required Entry Information** for each individual animal when you enter in the Ohio State Fair. Enter the required information from the registration paper to the online entry. Note: You may update or add substitution animal information until July 20, 2021. The form is available at www.ohiostatefair.com.

Required Entry Information: Breed, Class, Flock ID, Registration Number, Birth Date, Gender and Scrapie ID

NEW IN 2021- Showmanship will be entered online when making entries. Entry will be verified at check-in.

1. All breeding sheep and market lambs must have USDA official scrapie ear tag at the time of check in.

2. Exhibitor entry and registration paper check in will be on July 29 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. in the sheep barn office.

3. Junior Exhibitors must show their own animals. Exceptions will be made only for exhibitors who may be physically impaired, who have two animals entered in the same class, or an exhibitor is absent on show day due to other commitments. In case of these exceptions another boy or girl who is eligible to be an Ohio Junior Division Exhibitor and **must** be resident of the State of Ohio, may exhibit the animal with the authorization of the department director. If a Junior Fair Livestock Exhibitor cannot be present at the time of judging the exhibitor will need to present to the department director a written permission notice signed by the football coach, band director or any other person in charge of an activity that is in conflict and prevents the exhibitor from being present at the time of judging. This notice must be on official letterhead of the organization and given to the department director 24 hours before show day and must include name, county, birthdate, home phone number, and complete address of the exhibitor's, home and work of the person in charge of the event (i.e. football coach, band director, etc.) Also include a brief description of the event.

4. The name of exhibitor, as entered in the online entry process, must be the same name as the current owner as shown on breed registration papers. Family farm names listed on registration will be accepted at the 2021 junior breeding sheep show.

5. Exhibitors will be restricted to (2) two premium monies in each class.

6. Exhibitors may enter only one (1) entry in a group class. All animals entered and shown in a group class must be entered in the individual classes and registration certificates checked by clerks.

7. Breeding animals must bear the ear tag/tattoos required by their respective National Breed Association. All labels/tattoos must be plainly visible and properly inserted in the ear tissue. All identification tag/tattoo are checked at the time of judging.

8. Grand and Breed Champion classes are limited to first place animals. Second place animals may compete for reserve champion awards.

10. All special state/national breed association award winners will be paid direct by the respective breed association. Only one class award will be presented to each exhibitor.

11. All yearlings must be one year old and under two years old at the time of the show.

12. Due to a large number of entries, exhibitors may be restricted from using pens for tack, feeding and trimming.

13. No tents or canopies may be used until after the completion of the last show of the day, and must be removed before the first show of the day.

14. Please wash all sheep in the wash rack at the north end of the barn.

15. Any exhibitor requesting a late arrival needs to submit to the livestock office a photo of the registration papers that correspond to the sheep being entered prior at the time of check-in. Original registration papers must be presented upon arriving at the Ohio State Fair before the sheep will be allowed to compete for awards and premium money. Premiums will not be paid unless registration number of breeding animals is furnished prior to show.

16. Exhibitor will provide registration paper(s) at the time of check-in. Original is required. No copies will be accepted.

Late Entry(Only for Breeding Sheep)(June 21-July 20) required a \$75.00 late fee per exhibitor, per species, plus the regular entry charge per animal. If wanting to enter both Junior and Open, the \$75.00 will apply to each division plus the animal entry fee.

OUTSTANDING BREEDING SHEEP EXHIBITOR

Exhibitors placing first through ten will receive recognition.

Placings will be determined by exhibitors skillathon, showmanship, and animal placings.

BREEDING SHEEP SHOWMANSHIP

The exhibitors and their animals, their family members, and others acting on the behalf of the exhibitors, will follow Ohio's Livestock Show Reform Law, Chapter 901 of the Ohio Revised Code, and all rules under Ohio's Livestock Tampering Exhibition Rules, as set forth in Sections 901-19-1 through 901-19-21 and Section 901-19-33 of the Ohio Administrative Code. Animal/s being tested must be clear of any drug residue and be clear of any withdrawal periods.

A. Drenching of livestock at an exhibition is prohibited except for a medical condition at an exhibition when diagnosed by a licensed veterinarian.

B. Grooming Requirements

Based upon Rule 901-19-33, Prohibited Grooming Practices, the following grooming practices are prohibited:

a.) Using any substance to enhance or change the color of the livestock, including the livestock's hide or hooves;

b.) Adding any substance externally to build up, change or alter the shape or conformation of the livestock, including by way of example, but not limited to rope, false hair, graphite, hemp, and powders;

c.) Pigmented grooming aides or materials.

d.) Wool breed approved standards apply)

In addition, colored or pigmented substances, i.e. paint, are prohibited from use on market lambs and breeding. Painting of the hooves is prohibited. Use of clear substances is permitted. The sponsor of the exhibition will enforce rule 901-19-33, Prohibited Grooming Practices. Any exhibitor and the exhibitor's animal that does not follow the rule will be disqualified and awards will be forfeited. If the disqualified exhibitor has shown the exhibitor's animals, all animals placing below them will not move up

New Entering Procedure

All Junior Market Lambs MUST be owned by May 26, 2021
All market lambs MUST be entered online by June 20. No late entries will be accepted. Please make entries at www.ohiostatefair.com

Market/Commercial Show: Exhibitor may enter up to nine (9) market lambs: 6 into class 01 with entry fee and an additional 3 market lambs for substitution entered into class 02 at no charge.

Division 418

- class 01- market lambs (max 6 paid entries)
- class 02- substitution lambs (max 3 entries)
- class 03- commercial yearling ewe (max 2 entries)
- class 04- commercial ewe lamb (max 2 entries) Any exhibitor may show a total of 10 animals in the Market/Commercial Show.

Example: Maximum 6 market lambs, 2 commercial yearling ewes & 2 commercial ewe lambs.

All market lambs must have an official USDA Scrapie Tag or Premise I.D. tag in their ear at the time of classification. Upon check in each exhibitor MUST declare which lamb/s they entered on June 20 will be shown. These lambs will be identified by their 10 digit official USDA scrapie number listed on the online entry.

IMPORTANT RULES & REGULATIONS

The Overall Grand Champion and Reserved Grand Champion market lambs, which will sell in the sale of champions. Lambs placing 3rd, 4th, 5th will be entered in the carcass show and awarded a value premium at 3rd TBD, 4th TBD, and 5th TBD.

Note: The final placings: Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, 3rd, 4th, & 5th place market lambs will be designated for immediate harvest following the show.

All animals exhibited must have been a part of the exhibitor's project and cared for continuously by the individual exhibitor on and after May 26, including all showing rights. *Ownership of an animal will be considered lost if after May 26, of the current year, the animal has been consigned or sold in a Junior Fair Livestock Sale.*

Junior Exhibitors must show their own animals. Exceptions will be made only for exhibitors who may be physically impaired, who have two animals entered in the same class, or an exhibitor is absent on show day due to other commitments. In case of these exceptions another boy or girl who is eligible to be an Ohio Junior Division Exhibitor, **must** be resident of the State of Ohio, may exhibit the animal with the authorization of the department director. If a Junior Fair Livestock Exhibitor cannot be present at the time of judging the exhibitor will need to present to the department director a written permission notice signed by the football coach, band director or any other person in charge of an activity that is in conflict and prevents the exhibitor from being present at the time of judging. This notice must be on official letterhead of the organization and given to the department director 24 hours before show day and must include name, county, birthdate, home phone number, and complete address of the exhibitor's, home and work of the person in charge of the event (i.e. football coach, band director, etc.) Also include a brief description of the conflict.

Lambs showing any evidence of testicular tissue are not eligible for competition in any market lamb class or to sell. Lambs which show recent castration and which are not healed are not eligible for competition in any market lamb class or to sell.

(c) There will be an all-breed class for all lambs weighing 141 pounds and over at the time of the official weigh in. These lambs will not be eligible to compete for any other awards after the heavyweight class is placed.

(d) All market lambs must be under one year of age and show lamb mouth.

(e) All market lambs must be washed and freshly shorn and have a smooth appearance at the time of weigh in. Head wool is allowed.

7. White Faced Crossbreds and/or Black Faced Crossbreds White Faced Crossbreds are lambs showing evidence of both black face and white face breeding and must show evidence of such throughout the face, legs and ears and will be open to lambs of either sex. This class will also contain any Dorset, Southdown, or AOB White Face Wool breeds that do not meet its breed criteria pending Ohio State Fair classification. Natural Colored lambs must have natural colored wool over 50% of their body, excluding head and leg hair and will be open to lambs of either sex. Black Faced Crossbreds are for grade or crossbred black face lambs that do not qualify for the purebred classes (Hampshires, Shropshires, Oxfords, Suffolks) OR Natural and Black Faced All Other Breed lambs not meeting their specific criteria pending classification.

8. The following classes will be divided by declared weight: Hampshire, Southdown, White Face Cross, Natural Colored and Black Face Cross.

BREED CLASSIFICATION

All lambs entered in each breed (Hampshire, Shropshire, Southdown, Suffolk, Dorset, Oxford, Natural Colored, AOB & White Face Cross) will be group-evaluated in 3-lines with each classifier viewing each of the three lines. The (3) classifiers will select lambs to be placed in the "Classify Box" where selected lambs will be evaluated by the (3) classifiers and a vote taken for breed acceptance. Those lambs not selected for the "Classify Box" are successfully entered in the breed class.

Ohio State Fair classifiers decision is final. Regardless of the method followed, the judges' decision will be final. Breed classifiers will review the purebred, white face and natural colored classes only, and are to use the same standards for eligibility of purebred lambs as would be used for eligibility when registering purebred breeding lambs. Any disagreement with the breed classifiers' decisions can be voiced in an official protest as described in the General Rules found on the state fair website, www.ohiostatefair.com

All market lambs must be washed and freshly shorn with a smooth appearance at the time of classification. Head wool is allowed.

12. Any of the listed breeds failing to exhibit a three year average total of 12 animals in the market classes will be cause for evaluation of putting that breed within the All Other Breed Class of the Market Lamb Show.

Purebred Market Lamb Classes:

Purebred lambs of either sex, must be born to purebred parents of the same breed and must exhibit characteristics that would qualify them for registry. Lambs with black fiber regardless of reason are not allowed to show in purebred classes.

Droper: Breed standards are taken from the breed standard and training manual.

Point System: To distinguish the degree of excellence with a description and score by points on visual appearance. These values are the reflection of the animal. 5- Very Good, 4- Above Average, 3- Average, 2- Poor or below, 1- Very Poor, with cull points

Lambs receiving a score of 5, 4, or 3 from the appointed Ohio State Fair breed classifiers will be considered purebred Dropers and entered in the All Other Breeds purebred class.

13. The Ohio State Fair management reserves the right to make on-farm visits and secure nose prints of project animals at any time after May 26. All project animals are to be made available if an on-farm visit is made.

14. Lambs can only be shown in one breed classification.

15. No market lambs will be released from the barn until after the Saturday, August 7 show. All lambs are to be removed from the barn by 10:00 p.m., Saturday, August 7.

16. No pens may be reserved prior to the State Fair. Pens will be assigned during arrival hours.

17. Carpeting will be allowed only if the following conditions are met: a) No excess carpet may stick past the edge of the pen in either the pedestrian aisle or the exhibitors aisle. b) All carpet edges must be taped down to eliminate the problem of tripping over loose edges. c) All carpet must have either straw or shavings under the carpet in order to absorb moisture and reduce odor. d) All carpet must be removed from the pen at the conclusion of the show and either taken home or placed in the dumpster next to the sheep barn on the south side.

18. The Ohio State Fair is a slick sheared market lamb show. All lambs must be freshly shorn with an 13 tooth comb or less and washed by weigh in time. Head wool is allowed at weigh in. Lambs will be allowed leg wool from the knees and hocks down. Belly and flank wool must be completely shorn and equal to the length of wool on the body at the time of the show. Belly and flank wool will be checked on the top 3 lambs in each class at the time of re-weigh before entering the scales. Lambs will move up in a class if eliminated for belly or flank wool not equal to the length of the wool on the body.

19. One person per lamb in make up ring and show ring.

WEIGH-IN RULES

Market & Commercial lambs will show by a declared weight and the top five in each class will be weighed back before the final class placing is recorded.

Lambs must re-weigh within five (5) pounds of the official weight upper (greater number) weight. No lamb will be eliminated for weighing less (lower number). Lambs weighing 140 pounds will be allowed a five (5) pound re-weigh to a maximum weight of 145 pounds.

The exhibitors and their animals, their family members, and others acting on the behalf of the exhibitors, will follow Ohio's Livestock Show Reform Law, Chapter 901 of the Ohio Revised Code, and all rules under Ohio's Livestock Tampering Exhibition Rules, as set forth in Sections 901-19-1 through 901-19-21 and Section 901-19-33 of the Ohio Administrative Code.
