## 4-H AND FFA RULES

Youth may only participate in **either** the Ohio 4-H/FFA divisions (must be a resident of Ohio enrolled in Llama project in your county) **OR** the ILR youth division, *not both*.

4-H/FFA classes will be offered for **Ohio youth** showing llamas in 4-H or FFA. To qualify, a youth must be a member of their county's 4-H or FFA program and be enrolled in the Llama and Alpaca Project #132. Youth must show their project llama or alpaca at the Ohio State Fair. Youth under the age of 12 participating in this program are not allowed to show intact males over 18 months of age.

Classes offered will be showmanship, freestyle obstacle, trail pack and companion public relations. The showmanship classes will be judged separately from the ILR classes. Performance classes will be run with the ILR classes and be placed separately from the ILR classes.

Points will be tabulated according to the exhibitor's placings in all youth-eligible classes. These classes include (1) showmanship, (2) companion public relations, (3) freestyle obstacle, (4) trail pack.

Grand and Reserve Performance Champion awards will be presented for all 3 age divisions. Youth must enter at least 3 classes to be eligible for Grand and Reserve Grand Champion.

Companion public relations and freestyle obstacle are required. The third class used will be the higher points in either showmanship or trail pack.

## SHOW INFORMATION

1. Llamas and alpacas will be housed in the Brown Sheep and Llama Building. This is a large open air building with the Arena in the center and water and electricity close to each stall. The floor is concrete. Utilize as many 7' x 14' stalls as you need for your animals and tack, overnight sleeping accommodations, and one for your Farm Display at no additional cost. Tack is not permitted in animal stalls. Stalls will be 7' x 7' when you arrive. Pull the pin on one side and swing the center divider panel back to make a 7'x 14' stall. Please do not over crowd animals in stalls and be sure to bring enough high velocity fans and extension cords and multiple plugs. The plastic box fans will not help keep your animals cool. Duct tape all cords overhead.

Secure water buckets with bungies. Keep **ALL** stalls neat and clean looking at all times. Bring a broom to keep the area clean around your stalls. Please do not hang curtains or solid structures that restrict air flow. Bedding for your animals can be whatever you desire for concrete flooring. You do not need to clean out your stalls before leaving. Something should be brought to keep urine contained in the stall (kitty litter, oil-dri, etc.)

Arrival time is 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m., Thursday, July 22. Show begins at 2:00 p.m. Thursday, July 22. Driving into the facility and help with unloading will end at this time. Show crew and exhibitors with special concerns may come in on July 21 anytime after 12:00 noon. There are two entrances provided, drive in and the crew will help you unload. Please be prepared when you pull in to unload as quickly as possible.

2. All llamas showing in halter or fleece classes must be registered or listed with the ILR (including Non-breeders). Non-breeders, which are not designated as such on their Registration Certificate, must have a veterinarian certificate verifying the animal is a gelding, vasectomized male, or a spayed or non-reproductive female. Llamas and Alpacas being shown in Performance or Youth Classes only must have an ILR tracking number if they are not registered or listed. The cost is \$10 per year and you must obtain this number from the ILR before submitting your entry form.

3. **Ohio 4-H youth** ages as of January 1 are Junior - ages 8-11; Intermediate ages 12-15; Senior ages 16-18

Youth age divisions for all ILR performance classes, showmanship, and youth judging: ages 7 - 11 - Junior; ages 12 - 14 - Intermediate Youth; ages 15 -19 - Senior Youth.

4. Llamas and alpacas must be entered on the entry form by the exact name as listed on the Registration Certificate and by their owner.

6. Entry fee for each llama and alpaca is \$30. No charge for nursing babies under 5 months. No fee for animal stalls, farm display or tack stalls. There is an ILR \$3 per animal/per show fee. All halter animals fee will be \$6 because of the show being a double point show. "Fiber Products Only" - exhibitors must pay a \$3 ILR fee for all items entered and no animals. A per fleece ILR \$3 fee is also charged when that animal is not entered. These ILR fees will be paid at registration at the show.

7. Anyone who shows an animal and receives premiums, either as a Junior Exhibitor or Open Exhibitor, **MUST** have entered and paid entry fee.

8. Animal substitutions are not permitted from the original entry unless an animal becomes ill and prior permission is obtained from the show director (330-774-2513). The request for substitution must be accompanied by a veterinarian certificate verifying injury or illness and email to Debbie Arendas at llamadeb@aol.com

9. A youth may show only one animal in performance and may not share animals for showing. Youth under the age of 12 may not show an intact male over 18 months in any class. **Youth may show only in 4-H/FFA or ILR classes - not both.** Youth showing in 4-H/FFA **must be Ohio youth**, enrolled in a Llama/Alpaca project in their respected county. Youth participating in the judging contest are expected to dress appropriately as if they were an actual judge. This includes footwear.

10. Llamas and alpacas who have changed status (from novice to advanced) in any performance classes prior to this show time must change to the appropriate class during registration. This pertains to any and all open shows and show associations.

11. There will be no class changes of any kind, including wool length, following submission of your entry form.

12. **NO** companion llamas/alpacas or dogs permitted.

13. Premium and/or awards are subject to forfeiture by an exhibitor for violations of the Ohio State Fair Livestock Llama Division rules and regulations.

15. Llamas and alpacas entered in the show must be stalled on site on Thursday, July 22 to participate in the show. Any exceptions must be cleared thru the show superintendent at 330-774-2513. Animals may go home following their last class.

If a farm takes multiple animals through any one Adult Public Relations class, two of these animals may have the same handler. An animal may not be used in more than one Public Relations class. A youth may show only one animal in a Public Relations class. Youth under the age of 20 may not show in adult/advanced or adult/novice class.

### **TRAIL PACK**

If a farm takes multiple animals through any one Adult Pack class, two of these animals may have the same handler. An animal may not be used in more than one Pack class. Exhibitors must provide a pack with two cinches, and fill material to bulk packs out. Weight is optional on animals over 36 months old in adult classes. Youth classes must carry no weight. Alpacas must wear a pack proportionate in size to their body. A youth may show only one animal. Youth under the age of 20 may not show in adult/advanced or adult/novice class.

56—Adult Advanced — Handler age 20 and over. An Advanced Animal is defined as an animal who has earned 4 or more Grand or Reserve Championships in any Performance division (Novice, Open, or Youth) in any Show Association or Open Show with a minimum of 5 in the division.

57—Adult Novice — Handler age 20 and over. A Novice Animal is defined as an animal who has not earned 4 or more Grand or Reserve Championships in any Performance division (Novice, Open, or Youth) in any Show Association or Open Show with a minimum of 5 in the division.

58—ILR Senior Youth — Handler 15 through 19 years old. A training pack (2 cinches) may be used.

59—ILR Intermediate Youth — Handler 12 through 14 years old. A training pack (2 cinches) may be used.

60—ILR Junior Youth — Handler 7 through 11 years old. A training pack (2 cinches) may be used.

61—4-H/FFA Senior Youth — Handler 16 through 18 years old. A training pack (2 cinches) may be used.

62—4-H/FFA Intermediate Youth — Handler 12 through 15 years old. A training pack (2 cinches) may be used.

63—4-H/FFA Junior Youth — Handler 8 through 11 years old. A training pack (2 cinches) may be used.

### LEAPING LLAMA CONTEST

Open to any age llama, alpaca, and handler. Winners are the top animals that jump the highest over a single hurdle which will be consistently raised. Pole is cut off on the left so the handler does not have to cross the hurdle. The contest is divided into three (3) age groups: 0-5 years; 6-12 years; and 13 years and over. No registration necessary. Ribbons to all!

#### Grand Champion Adult Advanced Performance Animal

High point animal in Advanced Trail Pack, Advanced Companion Public Relations, and Advanced Freestyle Obstacle. Animal must be entered in all three.

#### Reserve Champion Adult Advanced Performance Animal

Second highest point animal in Advanced Trail Pack, Advanced Companion Public Relations, and Advanced Freestyle Obstacle. Animal must be entered in all three.

#### Grand Champion Adult Novice Performance Animal

High point animal in Novice Trail Pack, Novice Companion Public Relations, and Novice Freestyle Obstacle. Animal must be entered in all three.

#### Reserve Champion Adult Novice Performance Animal

Second highest point animal in Novice Trail Pack, Novice Companion Public Relations, and Novice Freestyle Obstacle. Animal must be entered in all three.

### LLAMA/ALPACA YOUTH AWARDS

Two awards will be given in each category. One for Ohio 4-H/FFA youth and one for ILR youth.

#### Grand Champion Performance Junior Youth

Highest scoring Junior Youth in Junior Youth Companion Public Relations, Junior Youth Freestyle Obstacle, and Junior Youth Trail Pack or Junior Youth Showmanship.

#### Reserve Champion Performance Junior Youth

Second highest scoring Junior Youth in Junior Youth Companion Public Relations, Junior Youth Freestyle Obstacle, and Junior Youth Trail Pack or Junior Youth Showmanship.

### **Grand Champion Performance Intermediate**

Highest scoring Intermediate Youth in Intermediate/Novice Youth Companion Public Relations, Intermediate/Novice Youth Freestyle Obstacle and Intermediate/Novice Youth Trail Pack or Intermediate/Novice Youth Showmanship.

### **Reserve Champion Performance Intermediate**

Second highest scoring Intermediate Youth in Intermediate/Novice Youth Companion Public Relations, Intermediate/Novice Youth Freestyle Obstacle and Intermediate/Novice Youth Trail Pack or Intermediate/Novice Youth Showmanship.

### **Grand Champion Performance Senior Youth**

Highest scoring Senior Youth in Senior/Advance Youth Companion Public Relations, Senior/Advanced Youth Freestyle Obstacle, and Senior/Advanced Youth Trail Pack or Senior/Advanced Youth Showmanship.

### **Reserve Champion Performance Senior Youth**

Second highest scoring Senior Youth in Senior/Advance Youth Companion Public Relations, Senior/Advanced Youth Freestyle Obstacle, and Senior/Advanced Youth Trail Pack or Senior/Advanced Youth Showmanship.

**NOTE:** Youth must be entered and show in Companion Public Relations, Trail Pack and Freestyle Obstacle with the same animal. A different animal may be used for Showmanship.

### **THE COMPOSITE AWARD**

The purpose of this award is to recognize animals with both exceptional conformation and fleece, along with encouraging participation in both halter and fleece.

All llamas shown in both their halter class and fleece on class are automatically entered.

The award combines points awarded for both halter and fleece on classes. If an animal is a champion in their halter class, those halter points will be used.

### **LLAMA AND ALPACA FIBER CLASSES**

The purpose of the "Llama/Alpaca Fiber Show" is to encourage the ability to harvest quality llama and alpaca fleeces for commercial, textile use, hand spinners, knitters, felters, crocheters, and weavers. This includes objectively looking at nutrition, pasturage health and grooming procedures.

Classes encourage everyone, from young people to adults, to exhibit their llama and alpaca fiber creations!

All fiber items must be in place by Thursday, July 22, 2:00 p.m., Brown Llama Building, and shall remain in place until closure of the Llama/Alpaca and Fiber Show. Please bring them to the check-in table in the Fiber Area. The animal does not change classes until the day after his date of birth. Please provide an entry tag for each entry. ILR-SD grading ribbons will also be awarded in all of the shorn and products divisions.

If you would like to participate in the fiber portion of the show and are not attending please send all fleeces, yarn, projects or products to Cherreen Thompson with a \$10 check. She will transport them to the fair, have them judged, and return to you.

### **SHORN FLEECE**

Any fleece entered shall be discriminated against and subject to disqualification if the fleece shows any definite defect including the following:

- a. Poorly prepared, containing excessive dirt and plant material, tags, burrs, etc.
- b. Any sign or stage of insect infestation.

For the shorn fleece, do not include the dirty base of the neck. Start at withers and continue to dock of tail; then down the sides, but not under the belly.

For uniformity, boxes will be available but must remain on site. Fleeces must be brought to the show in a clear plastic bag, provided by owner, to protect fiber while on display.



A copy of each animal's Registration Certificate must accompany the fleece brought to the show for display. A photo of the animal is desirable, but not required.

An entry tag should be filled out for each entry and brought to the show. Give animal's birthdate, gender, date of shearing, date of previous shearings and owner information.

### FLEECE ON CLASS

The purpose of Fleece On is to provide the opportunity for llama owners to have a professional evaluation and score of the fleece on the animal. Llamas can be judged either shorn or unshorn. Hands on judging will be done on an individual basis on Thursday, July 22 between 2:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. in the Fiber Display area. More details will be given at the Exhibitor Meeting. The placings for the Walking Fleece classes will be awarded in the Show Arena, Saturday, July 24.

If you are bringing an animal for fleece on class only, you must pay the \$30 entry fee, \$10 class fee, and \$3 ILR-SD fee.

### YARN

The purpose of the yarn classes is to evaluate the skill of hand spinning. Skeins must be hand spun by the exhibitor. Yarn must consist of llama and/or alpaca fiber only. Exception is Class 92- Versatility Spinning. Skeins must be two or more ounces in weight. A statement of the yarn's intended use must be included on a note card. Do not include any identifying information on this card. In order to be judged, the yarn should be wound on a two yard niddy-noddy and gently figure-eight tied in four places. Put in a zip lock bag for protection while on display. Do not twist into a tight skein; leave hanging loosely. Fiber may be 100% llama or 100% alpaca or a combination of the two. If combination, notation should be made. Llama and alpaca fiber must be pure and natural, but may be dyed. Must be hand spun by exhibitor. Indicate on a note card whether spun on a spinning wheel or hand spindle and identify the method of processing whether commercial (by a mill) or by hand.

Ribbons will be given to five places.

This confirmation will take the place of the required signatures.

### LATE ENTRY

Any entry made **June 21- July 20** requires a \$75.00 late fee per exhibitor, per species, plus the usual per animal charge. If wanting to enter both Junior and Open, then it would be \$75.00 for each area, plus the animal entry fee.

To make a later entry, you will email Barb Prince at [b.prince@expo.ohio.gov](mailto:b.prince@expo.ohio.gov). Include in email exhibitor information, classes entering and any animal information required for your species.

### TICKET AND PARKING INFORMATION

100—Novice Spun Two Ply: Plain or Slub Yarn. For spinners with two years or less of experience. Open to all ages. (Points Class)

101—Spun Yarn: Plain or Slub Yarn. This class is for spinners with two years or more experience. Open to all ages. (Point Class)

102—Dyed Yarn: Any ply. On a note card, indicate the type of dye used and the technique used to dye the yarn. Open to all ages.

103—Versatility Spinning: Notions may be used in this class, such as novelty metallic threads, beads, etc. Entry of three or more separate skeins using different spinning techniques. If skeins are not all llama or alpaca note percentage of other fiber used. Include note card describing yarns and uses for each skein. Submit card with skeins. Open to all ages.

### LLAMA AND ALPACA PRODUCTS

Products may contain 10-15% of their whole in another fiber. You must mark it as a blend, what the other fiber is and how much of it is in your finished product. Products are to be handmade by the exhibitor. A small amount of embellishment is allowed, such as a button, bead or novelty yarn. Professionally spun yarn permitted but must be identified in the item description. Fiber must be natural, but may be dyed. Medium used may be knitting, crocheting, weaving, felting or roving artistry. Put item in clear plastic for protection while on display. Include with each project on a note card: 1) description of the fiber used and percentage of fiber that is not llama or alpaca; 2) why you made this particular item; 3) how long you've practiced this skill; 4) other information helpful to the judge.

104—Youth Project: (18 yrs. and under) Products can be knitted, crocheted, felted, or woven, using raw fleece, yarn, or roving. On a note card give why you choose to make this product, how you learned this skill, how long you have practiced this skill, and your age. Submit card with Product. (Points Class)

105—Felted Product: On a note card tell how your product was felted (hand, needle, wet, knit, crochet, etc.) and how long you have practiced this skill. Submit card with product. Open to all ages. (Point Class)

106—Knitted Product: On a note card tell about your product, yarn used, and how long you have practiced this skill. Submit card with product. Open to all ages. (Points Class)

107—Crocheted Product: On a note card tell about your product, yarn used, and how long you have practiced this skill. Submit card with product. (Points Class)

108—Woven Product: On a note card tell about your product, yarn used, and how long you have practiced this skill. Submit card with your product. Open to all ages. (Points Class)
